

THE SACRAMENT OF HOLY BAPTISM

Holy Baptism in The Episcopal Church is at heart the entrance into a way of life. This way of life is rooted in Christian community and borne out by a commitment to Christian discipleship in the world. Baptism is best celebrated during the weekly Sunday worship: publicly, and with the whole worshipping congregation present.

On the day of Baptism, the congregation celebrates this person as "marked as Christ's own forever" and welcomes him or her into the community of faith. We ask God to give this person "an inquiring and discerning heart, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know God and to love God, and the gift of joy and wonder in all God's works." (The Book of Common Prayer, p. 308)

In the early Church preparation for the sacrament of Baptism required three years of study, prayer, and practice—a period called catechesis. Candidates, or catechumens, read from the Scriptures daily, worshipped regularly, examined their lives with the help of a church elder, explored their spiritual gifts (how and where they were called by God to serve), and engaged in servant leadership within their community. The core awareness leading up to the day of Baptism is that committing to love in the world as Jesus loves is the adventure of a lifetime and our deepest calling as human beings.

With this in mind, candidates and/or their parents and Godparents are asked to engage in the following activities within the St. Chrysostom's community summed up by Worship, Study, Serve, Give, Share.

- Attend a Baptism class, usually the Saturday morning before Baptism
- Engage in a rhythm of regular Sunday worship
- Make a <u>financial "pledge" commitment</u> to the work of God through your local church (a percentage
 of household income moving incrementally toward the 10% Biblical standard of giving);
- Read one of the Biblical Gospels (Matthew 3:13–17, Mark 1:9–11, Luke 3:21–22and John 1:29–34);
- Find a way to connect with the church community in a meaningful way;
- Baptismal candidates and/or their families may work with the clergy to select one or more members
 of the congregation to serve as sponsors. Candidates who are children may have a sponsor or
 Godparent outside of the local congregation and a sponsor within the congregation.

Thanksgiving over the Water

Celebrant

The Celebrant blesses the water, first saying

The Lord be with you.

People And also with you.

Celebrant Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People It is right to give God thanks and praise.

We thank you, Almighty God, for the gift of water. Over it the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation. Through it you led the children of Israel out of their bondage in Egypt into the land of promise. In it your Son Jesus received the baptism of John and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah, the Christ, to lead us, through his death and resurrection, from the bondage of sin into everlasting life. We thank you, Father, for the water of Baptism. In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection. Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit. Therefore in joyful obedience to your Son, we bring into his fellowship those who come to him in faith, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Now sanctify this water, we pray you, by the power of your Holy Spirit, that those who here are cleansed from sin and born again may continue forever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Savior. To him, to you, and to the Holy Spirit, be all honor and glory, now and forever. Amen.

The Baptism

The candidate is presented by name to the Celebrant, who pours water upon the candidate, saying

CANDIDATE, I baptize you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy

Spirit. Amen.

All Heavenly Father, we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit you have bestowed

upon these your servants the forgiveness of sin, and have raised them to the new life of grace. Sustain them, O Lord, in your Holy Spirit. Give them an inquiring and discerning heart, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love you, and the

gift of joy and wonder in all your works. Amen.

CANDIDATE, you are sealed by the Holy Spirit in Baptism and marked as Christ's own

forever.

People Amen.

The Candidate is presented with a lit baptismal candle, saying

Deacon Receive the light of Christ.

Celebrant Let us welcome the newly baptized.

People We receive you into the household of God. Confess the faith of Christ crucified,

proclaim his resurrection, and share with us in his eternal priesthood.

Celebrant The peace of God be always with you.
