

THE FIRST LESSON

Genesis 18:1-15

The Lector says A reading from the book of Genesis.

The Lord appeared to Abraham by the oaks of Mamre, as he sat at the entrance of his tent in the heat of the day. He looked up and saw three men standing near him. When he saw them, he ran from the tent entrance to meet them, and bowed down to the ground. He said, "My lord, if I find favor with you, do not pass by your servant. Let a little water be brought, and wash your feet, and rest yourselves under the tree. Let me bring a little bread, that you may refresh yourselves, and after that you may pass on—since you have come to your servant." So they said, "Do as you have said." And Abraham hastened into the tent to Sarah, and said, "Make ready quickly three measures of choice flour, knead it, and make cakes." Abraham ran to the herd, and took a calf, tender and good, and gave it to the servant, who hastened to prepare it. Then he took curds and milk and the calf that he had prepared, and set it before them; and he stood by them under the tree while they ate.

They said to him, "Where is your wife Sarah?" And he said, "There, in the tent." Then one said, "I will surely return to you in due season, and your wife Sarah shall have a son." And Sarah was listening at the tent entrance behind him. Now Abraham and Sarah were old, advanced in age; it had ceased to be with Sarah after the manner of women. So Sarah laughed to herself, saying, "After I have grown old, and my husband is old, shall I have pleasure?" The Lord said to Abraham, "Why did Sarah laugh, and say, 'Shall I indeed bear a child, now that I am old?' Is anything too wonderful for the Lord? At the set time I will return to you, in due season, and Sarah shall have a son." But Sarah denied, saying, "I did not laugh"; for she was afraid. He said, "Oh yes, you did laugh."

THE PRESENTATION AND EXAMINATION OF THE CANDIDATE

The Celebrant says The Candidate for Holy Baptism will now be presented.

Each Candidate is presented individually by their parents and/ or sponsors

Sponsors *I present N. to receive the Sacrament of Baptism.*

The Celebrant asks the parents and/ or sponsors

Will you be responsible for seeing that the person you present is brought up in the Christian faith and life? *We will, with God's help.*

Will you by your prayers and witness help this person to grow into the full stature of Christ? *We will, with God's help.*

Then the Celebrant asks the following questions of the candidates who can speak for themselves, and of the parents and sponsors who speak on behalf of the infants and younger children

Do you renounce Satan and all the spiritual forces of wickedness that rebel against God? *I renounce them.*

Do you renounce the evil powers of this world which corrupt and destroy the creatures of God? *I renounce them.*

Do you renounce all sinful desires that draw you from the love of God? *I renounce them.*

Do you turn to Jesus Christ and accept him as your savior? *I do.*

Do you put your whole trust in his grace and love? *I do.*

Do you promise to follow and obey him as your Lord? *I do.*

The Celebrant addresses the congregation, saying

Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support *these children* in *their* life in Christ?

People **We will.**

Celebrant Let us join with *them* as *they* are committed Christ and renew our own baptismal covenant.

THE BAPTISMAL COVENANT

Celebrant Do you believe in God the Father?

People **I believe in God the Father Almighty,
creator of heaven and earth.**

Celebrant Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

People **I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord.
He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit
and born of the Virgin Mary.
He suffered under Pontius Pilate,
was crucified, died, and was buried.
He descended to the dead.
On the third day he rose again.
He ascended into heaven,
and is seated at the right hand of the Father.
He will come again to judge the living and the dead.**

Celebrant Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

People **I believe in the Holy Spirit,
the holy catholic Church,
the communion of saints,
the forgiveness of sins,
the resurrection of the body,
and the life everlasting.**

Celebrant Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers?

People **I will, with God's help.**

Celebrant Will you persevere in resisting evil, and, whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord?

People **I will, with God's help.**

Celebrant Will you proclaim by word and example the Good News of God in Christ?
People I will, with God's help.

Celebrant Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbor as yourself?
People I will, with God's help.

Celebrant Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being?
People I will, with God's help.

PRAYERS FOR THE CANDIDATE

The Celebrant then says to the People

Let us now pray for *this child* who is to receive the Sacrament of new birth.

Intercessor Deliver them, O Lord, from the way of sin and death.
People Lord, hear our prayer.

Intercessor Open their hearts to your grace and truth.
People Lord, hear our prayer.

Intercessor Fill them with your holy and life-giving Spirit.
People Lord, hear our prayer.

Intercessor Keep them in the faith and communion of your holy Church.
People Lord, hear our prayer.

Intercessor Teach them to love others in the power of the Spirit.
People Lord, hear our prayer.

Intercessor Send them into the world in witness to your love.
People Lord, hear our prayer.

Intercessor Bring them to the fullness of your grace and glory.
People Lord, hear our prayer.

Intercessor Knit them together with this community as we lift up those on our prayer list this week: **Jan, David, Doug, Esther, Sam, Pam, Lucinda, Emily, John, Richard, Clare, John, Julie, Emily, Beth, Erica & Chuck, Grace, The Lukas Family, Elizabeth, St. Leonard's Ministries**, and for the special needs and concerns of this congregation.

The People may add their own petitions silently or aloud.

Intercessor We pray for all who have died in the communion of your church, and we praise you for your saints who have entered into joy.

The People may add their own petitions silently or aloud.

The Celebrant concludes Grant, O Lord, that all who are baptized into the death of Jesus Christ your Son may live in the power of his resurrection and look for him to come again in glory; who lives and reigns now and for ever. **Amen.**

THANKSGIVING OVER THE WATER

Celebrant The Lord be with you.

People And also with you.

Celebrant Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People It is right to give God thanks and praise.

The Celebrant continues We thank you, Almighty God, for the gift of water. Over it the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation. Through it you led the children of Israel out of their bondage in Egypt into the land of promise. In it your Son Jesus received the baptism of John and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah, the Christ, to lead us, through his death and resurrection, from the bondage of sin into everlasting life.

We thank you, Father, for the water of Baptism. In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection. Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit. Therefore in joyful obedience to your Son, we bring into his fellowship those who come to him in faith, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

At the following words, the Celebrant touches the water:

Now sanctify this water, we pray you, by the power of your Holy Spirit, that those who here are cleansed from sin and born again may continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Savior. To him, to you, and to the Holy Spirit, be all honor and glory, now and for ever. **Amen.**

THE BAPTISM

The Candidate is presented by name to the Priest, who then pours water upon the Candidate, saying
N., I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

Then the Priest places a hand on the Candidate's head, marking on the forehead the sign of the cross, and saying
N., you are sealed by the Holy Spirit in Baptism and marked as Christ's own for ever.

When this has been done, the Priest prays over them, saying
Let us pray. Heavenly Father, we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit you have bestowed upon this your servant the forgiveness of sin, and have raised them to the new life of grace. Sustain them, O Lord, in your Holy Spirit. Give them inquiring and discerning hearts, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love you, and the gift of joy and wonder in all your works. **Amen.**

When the Baptisms are finished, the Celebrant says

Let us welcome the newly baptized.
People **We receive you into the household of God.**
Confess the faith of Christ crucified, proclaim his resurrection, and share with us in his eternal priesthood.

Holy and gracious God: In your infinite love you made us for yourself; and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and maker of all. Jesus stretched out his arms upon the cross, and offered himself, in obedience to your will, a perfect sacrifice for the whole world. On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, our Savior Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, “Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me.” After supper Jesus took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, “Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Ach bleib bei uns, Herr Jesu Christ (Abide with us, Lord Jesus Christ) is one of the six *Schübler Chorales*, Bach's transcriptions of movements from various cantatas. This collection was published during his lifetime. The setting is in trio form: the melody is heard in the soprano while the left hand and pedal play a lively accompaniment.

John Cook (1918-1984) was Organist-Choirmaster at Boston's Church of the Advent where he presided over one of the country's pre-eminent church music programs. His *Jubilate Deo* is written for unison voices in his bright, rhythmic style over a colorful organ accompaniment.

Bach's *E Major Toccata* is a youthful work, patterned after the great toccatas of Lübeck's famed organist, Dietrich Buxtehude. The work contains a toccata, fugue, toccata and second fugue. We hear the opening *Toccata*, written as an exuberant fanfare, and the closing *Fugue* which states a majestic theme, ending in a brilliant coda.

Cover art is *Abraham and the Three Angels*, Gerbrand van den Eeckhout, 1656, and is under Public Domain.
